

Cancer Awareness Day

Here is the change! The “color” of the day will not just be pink or purple! Did you know that Childhood cancers are represented by the color gold? Or that Leukemia and kidney cancers are represented with an orange ribbon? The teal ribbon represents Ovarian cancer and burgundy ribbons represent multiple myeloma. Did you know that head and neck cancers are represented by the ribbon that is burgundy and ivory? And depending on what list you look at yellow or lavender can represent all cancers.

Unfortunately the list goes on and on, but we are hoping the students will give some thought to what color they would like to wear. Even better, as a family spend a few minutes talking about what color they want to wear for someone they may know and love who is dealing with cancer or better yet, surviving cancer!
