Screening of “The Story of Eva” set for February 8, 2020 at St. Rose of Lima Catholic Church in Franklin starts at 9:30AM

Holocaust survivor Eva Mozes Kor stood just 4’9” tall, but she seems larger than life when the “Story of Eva” is shown on the big screen at St. Rose of Lima on February 8, 2020. [WFYI Public Media](#) in collaboration with [Ted Green Films](#) and Mika Brown, offers incredible details about Kor’s journey from Romanian Jewish farm girl to Nazi death camp survivor to a leading global force on the power of healing through forgiveness.

“I heard (Nazi Dr. Josef) Mengele say that I only had two weeks to live, and I decided I was going to prove him wrong,” Kor said in reflecting about her Auschwitz experience as a 10-year-old child. *“I didn’t understand what I did. Why did Hitler hate me?”*

In her 80’s Kor had a better understanding of why she endured so many trials throughout her life. Her captivating story doesn’t come without controversy, particularly her decision to publicly forgive Mengele, Hitler and all Nazis, and it’s all part of “The Story of Eva: A-7063”, masterfully written and produced by award-winning filmmaker Ted Green.

The film captures this remarkable legacy, carries Eva’s critically important message to future generations and shows, most of all, the power for good that just one dedicated person can have. It serves as a tool to discuss difficult history – for those who lived through it, for loved ones and younger friends who heard their stories, and for those who can’t fathom that such a world once existed. It helps viewers discover shared values. It encourages peace and kindness.

Green and co-producer Brown have traveled the world capturing heartfelt interviews and stunning scenes of Kor’s most significant successes – stories of lives changed after hearing about her experiences and life perspective. The film is narrated by Hollywood icon Ed Asner and includes on-camera appearances in Auschwitz; comments from CNN’s Wolf Blitzer, former NBA great Ray Allen, TV and movie star Elliott Gould and many others who reveal touching accounts of Kor’s impact on their own lives.

St. Rose of Lima doors will open at 9:00AM on February 8 for the viewing at 9:30AM. This showing is open to the public; there is no charge for the presentation by WFYI’s Jessica Chapman; this showing is expected to attract a crowd of viewers.
